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## Single Helix – Full Day Workshop

**Description:** Cubes stack then vanish as the helix guides your transition through time and space. It's all in the illusion of a three dimensional design based on tumbling blocks. A modern wall hanging that is visually challenging yet easy to stitch. Both the cubes and helix are cut from the "kite" shape and stitched using the Butterfly Seam.


## Fabric Requirements:

- (6) fabrics (3 per color group in light, medium and dark) 4<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x WOF
- (6) 3" x WOF accent fabrics, assorted
- 2 strips 3<sup>1</sup>/<sub>2</sub>" x 40" neutral fabric
- <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub> yard for finishing and binding
- 40" x 40" batting.

Special tools: Gyleen's Polygon3 (\$15)

**Instructions:** Pattern (\$10)

## **General supplies:**



Sewing machine with manual (are machines provided?); <sup>1</sup>/<sub>4</sub>" foot without edge guide (if possible); (2) thread colors, one for the top and another in the bobbin and that is visible on the wrong side of fabric; seam ripper; thread snips; rotary cutter, ruler and mat; extension cord (if needed); straight pins; finger pressing tool; and batting to use as a design wall (optional).

**Gyleen's thoughts:** This design class can go anywhere you want to go. The basic structure is tumbling blocks and as such using two colors groups in light, medium and dark for the large kites works well. As for the smaller kites, odds and ends or plan both are great choices.
